BISX COO SPEAKS TO ROTARY CLUB MEETING

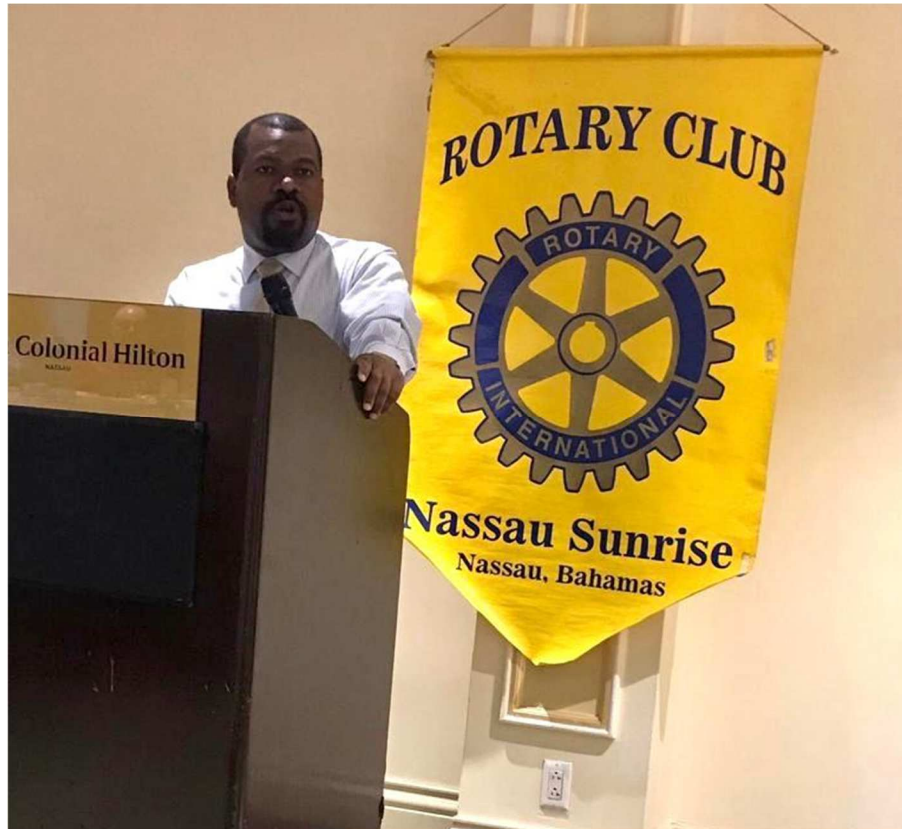
